Documentation should kept on file by the school and it should be provided to the facility as requested.</li> <li>Dalia – DH needs annual screening signed by healthcare provider.</li> <li>Forms committee has offered to look at the different yearly screening forms, please send forms to Yvette and team can look at all forms.
