6 in 10 deaths from suicide or SUD

While Colorado's rate and the number of deaths are lower than the national average, the state's rate has nearly doubled since 2013. Between 2014 and 2016, there were 94 deaths, seventy-two of which (76.6%) were determined to be preventable by the <u>state Maternal Mortality Review Committee</u>. Mental health and substance use contributed to nearly six out of every ten deaths, with Native American populations experiencing the most disproportionate impact in Colorado.

The MMPP identified three major pathways through which maternal mortality can begin to be addressed:

- Increasing social connectedness and the ability of pregnant and postpartum Coloradans to feel connected, supported and a sense of belonging.
- Increasing economic security or mobility among pregnant and postpartum Coloradans.
- Increasing the community's collective capacity (people, resources, or infrastructure) to care for and support pregnant and postpartum individuals, formally and informally.
